COVID-19 Emergency Assistance Grants to Students  
From Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2021 (CRRSAA) and  
American Rescue Plan Act, 2021 (ARP)  
January 1, 2022 – March 31, 2022 Report

The Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA ) established the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund II (HEERF II) and was passed by Congress and signed into law on December 27, 2020. HEERF II allocates funding to institutions to provide emergency grants for students with exceptional need. The Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund III (HEERF III) was authorized by the American Rescue Plan (ARP), and signed into law on March 11, 2021, in support of institutions of higher education to serve students and ensure learning continues during the COVID-19 pandemic. Healing Hands School of Holistic Health has signed and returned the Certification and Agreement forms to the Department of Education. As a result of these Acts, Healing Hands School intends to use the funds to provide emergency financial aid grants to students. This information is to be updated no later than 10 days after the end of each calendar quarter (September 30, December 31, March 31, and June 30), unless the Secretary specifies an alternative method of reporting.

- The total amount of funds that the institution has been allocated under HEERF II: \$169,720. The total amount of funds that the institution has been allocated under the HEERF III: \$105,517.
- Of those funds, the total amount that has been distributed to students as of the date of reporting: as of March 31, 2022, \$57,550 has been disbursed to students.
- The estimated total number of students at the institution eligible to participate in programs and therefore eligible to receive an emergency financial aid grant: We estimate 625 students could be eligible.
- The total number of students who have received an emergency financial aid grant: as of March 31, 2022, the total number of students who have received an emergency assistance grant is 59.
- How the institution determined which students will receive emergency financial aid grants and how much funding they will receive: students with pressing financial need are being contacted and sent a COVID-19 Emergency Assistance Grant Authorization. Emergency Assistance Grant award amounts are based on financial need, the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), and data from the Emergency Assistance Grant Authorization.
- Any instructions, directions, or guidance provided by the institution to students concerning the emergency financial aid grants: the COVID-19 Emergency Assistance Grant Authorization provides guidance concerning the emergency financial aid grants.
